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SAMSARA 3

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- samsara
 - transmigration/reincarnation, karmic cycle, or Punarjanman, and cycle of aimless drifting, wandering or mundane existence
 - The liberation from saṃsāra is called Moksha, Nirvāṇa, Mukti, or Kaivalya.
 - Jivanmukti (liberation and freedom in this life)
 - Videhamukti (liberation and freedom in after-life)
 - phenomenal world (Maya).
 - absolute Atman (Self)
 - unchanging immortal reality and bliss called Brahman
 - Anattā (no self) and Śūnyatā (emptiness)
 - bhakti (devotion), karma (work), jñāna (knowledge), or raja (meditation) is self-liberation (moksha) from saṃsāra
 - wheel of existence (Bhavacakra) or six realms or six paths
 - the three benevolent destinies (kuśalagati)
 - the world of gods or celestial beings (deva) ;
 - the world of warlike demigods (asura) ;
 - the world of human beings (manushya) ;
 - unbenevolent destinies (akuśalagati)
 - the world of animals (tiryagyonī) ;
 - the world of hungry ghosts (preta) ;
 - the world of Hell (naraka).

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
